Harris County Appraisal District Named A Top Houston Workplace

Houston — The Harris County Appraisal District (HCAD) has been selected as one of the top workplaces in the Houston metropolitan area by the Houston Chronicle for the second year in a row.

HCAD was ranked number 9 in the large company category on the Chronicle's list of Top Workplaces for 2018, moving up from the number 16 spot in 2017.

“We feel privileged to be included among the Top Workplaces, especially after seeing the other notable organizations on the list,” said Roland Altinger, chief appraiser. “This award reaffirms that our success depends on our people. We create a family atmosphere where everyone is listened to, respected and valued.”

The top workplaces lists are based solely on the results of an employee feedback survey administered by Energage LLC, a Pennsylvania-based firm that provides technology-based employee engagement tools. The anonymous survey measures several aspects of workplace culture, including alignment, execution and connection.
