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HCAD Clarifies Elderly And Disabled Exemption

Houston — The Harris Central Appraisal District (HCAD) has worked with Texas Senator Paul Bettencourt to clarify that the intent of Senate Bill 23 was to extend to surviving spouses of elderly homeowners.

S.B. 23 increases the homestead exemption for elderly and disabled homeowners to \$60,000 from \$10,000. In applying the exemptions, the appraisal district did not extend the benefit to surviving spouses.

However, Senator Bettencourt, the author of the bill, made it clear yesterday afternoon in a call to the district that it was his intent and the legislature's intent to pass along the additional \$50,000 increase in the homestead exemption for elderly persons to surviving spouses.

Therefore, it will be HCAD's policy that surviving spouses will receive the benefit of this increased exemption.
